

Percent of students reporting missing school because of feeling unsafe at school or on the way to and from school



Percent of students reporting fighting at school in the past 12 months



Number of disciplinary referrals for fighting & bullying



OTHER SAFETY AND VIOLENCE 4^{TH} -5TH GRADE SURVEY

- 22% do not feel safe <u>at school</u>
- 11% <u>missed days</u> at school due to not feeling safe at school
- 18% do not feel safe on the way to and from school
- \odot 27% do not feel safe on the bus
- 27% do not feel safe at the <u>bus stop</u>

OTHER SAFETY AND VIOLENCE 6TH -9TH GRADE SURVEY

- o 23% do not feel safe at school
 - 25% at 9th grade
- 11% <u>missed days</u> at school due to not feeling safe at school
 - 11% at 9th grade
- 34% have <u>been harassed or bullied</u> on school property in the past 12 months
 - 26% at 9th grade
- 25% have <u>harassed or bullied another student</u> on school property in the past 12 months
 - 23% at 9th grade

VIOLENCE PREVENTION STRATEGIES

• Too Good for Violence Curriculum

- Reach = 94% of targeted 4th & 5th grade students
 (2,926 of 3,127 enrolled at 15 targeted schools in 2011-2012)
- 6.6 lessons each, 90% completed at least 80% of curriculum
- 571 hours of instruction delivered

School Safety Officer

- 10 threat assessments
- 64 vulnerability assessment
- 83 school consultations
- 32 gang awareness training sessions

WEAPONS & GANGS $4^{TH} - 5^{TH} \text{ GRADE SURVEY}$

WEAPONS

- 3% said they brought a knife or gun to school in the past 12 months (up from 2% last year)
- 18% said they had seen another student bring a knife or gun to school in the past 12 months (up from 15%)

GANGS

- 14% said gangs were at their school (down from 16%)
- 12% said they had been asked to join a gang (same)
- 4% said they were in a gang (same)

Weapons & Gangs 6TH – 9TH Grade Survey


WEAPONS

- 5% said they had carried a weapon such as a knife or gun on school property in the past 30 days (same as last year)
- 21% know someone else who brought a weapon such as a gun or knife on school property in the past 30 days (same)
- 8% said someone had threatened or injured them with a weapon on school property in the past 12 months (down from 9%)
- 5% said they had threatened or injured someone with a weapon on school property in the past 12 months (down from 6%)

GANGS

- 52% said gangs were at their school (70% at 9th only) (down from 56%)
- 19% said they had been asked to join a gang (20% at 9th only) (down from 21%)
- 7% said they were in a gang (down from 8%)
 - 4.3% at 6th grade
 - 7.5% at 7th grade
 - 7.4% at 8th grade
 - 8.0% at 9th grade




Percent of students reporting using marijuana on one or more days in the past 30 days

Marijuana USE SS/HS Schools compared to State FYSAS


Percent of students reporting using marijuana in the past 30 days

Percent of students reporting using marijuana in the past 30 days



Percent of students who think using marijuana daily or almost daily is harmless/mostly harmless




Percent of students reporting consuming alcohol on one or more days in the past 30 days

ALCOHOL USE SS/HS Schools compared to State FYSAS


Percent of students reporting consuming alcohol in the past 30 days



Percent of students who think consuming alcohol daily or almost daily is harmless/mostly harmless




Percent of students reporting using an over the counter drug for the purpose of getting high in the past 30 days

Percent of students reporting OTC drug in the past 30 days




Percent of students who have taken a drug that can be purchased from a store without a prescription, such as cold or cough medication, for the purpose of getting high, during the past 30 days



Percent of students reporting using a prescription drug in the past 30 days







Percent of students reporting using tobacco on one or more days in the past 30 days




SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION

- Project Success Curriculum
 - Reach = 92% of targeted 7th grade students
 (2,041 of 2,229 enrolled at 6 targeted schools in 2011-2012)
 - 324 hours of instruction delivered
 - 85% completed at least 80% of lessons
 - Average 3.8 lessons per student
- Project SUCCESS small groups (6th– 9th)
- Back on Track program
- Newspaper in Education, The Power of Choice
- Parent Forums on ATOD prevention and violence prevention

ADDITIONAL ATOD INDICATORS 6TH -9TH GRADE SURVEY

- For 436 students who reported alcohol use, they obtained the alcohol from:
 - A party (43%)
 - Home (29%)
 - Family member (17%)
 - Store (11%)
- For those who reported drinking alcohol (456 students), 38% were with friends when they drank, 20% were alone, and 21% were with family members
- For those who reported smoking marijuana (389 students), 63% were with friends when they smoked and 22% were alone


